Coronation Park:

Did You Know?

Coronation Park was named in 1953 in honour of Queen Elizabeth II's coronation.

3. What is the name of the Creek running beside Coronation Park?

St. Andrew's Graveyard:

1. Who donated the land on which St. Andrew's Church is built? *Hint: Find the historical plaque.*

2. In what year was the first log church built?

Did You Know?

The wooden gate at the entrance to St. Andrew's cemetery has a special name. It's called a Lych gate. This is a special structure traditionally found at the entrance of English-style churchyards. The St. Andrew's L*ych gate is one of very few in Canada. It was erected in 1916 in memory of Linus Woolverton, a prominent Grimsby citizen and a dedicated member of St. Andrew's parish.
