


PLACES OF INTEREST

1 ELIZABETH STREET PUMPHOUSE

447 Elizabeth Street

This popular destination offers a large open space, canoe/kayak launch, waterfront, 1812 BiCentennial Peace Gardens and the start of the 40 Mile Creek side trail. It contains features such as lakefront access, gardens, a public parking lot, washrooms inside the facility, and a recreation trail nearby.

2 GRIMSBY PICKLEBALL COURTS

Baker Road North

4 outdoor Pickleball courts that are used for league play and also for drop in visitors. Racquets can be borrowed from the Grimsby Peach King Centre. Use for public times is first come, first served.

3 GRIMSBY TENNIS CLUB

46 St. Andrews Avenue

Grimsby also has four full sized tennis courts located at 46 St. Andrews Avenue. The Grimsby tennis courts are operational from mid May to October, weather dependent. Two of the courts are available for public use during weekday daytime hours.

4 LIVINGSTON ACTIVITY CENTRE

18 Livingston Avenue

The Livingston Activity Centre is a community recreation facility, home to the Grimsby Seniors Club among several other organizations. Featuring an auditorium complete with a stage, full kitchen, several meeting rooms, lounge and boardroom.

5 GRIMSBY PUBLIC LIBRARY

18 Carnegie Lane

The Grimsby Public Library (GPL) enriches the lives of the community by connecting members to the library and each other through inspirational programs, collections and services.

6 GRIMSBY PUBLIC ART GALLERY

18 Carnegie Lane

Grimsby Public Art Gallery, our local public art gallery features exhibitions of contemporary artwork, art classes and workshops for children and adults. Home to the Gallery Shop which offers hand crafted gifts made in Canada.

7 CARNEGIE BUILDING

25 Adelaide Street

Originally built in 1912, and then restored in 2017, the Carnegie building is one of 125 Carnegie buildings constructed in Canada. The facility has a community room that is available for special occasion and weekly rentals.

8 NELLES MANOR MUSEUM

126 Main Street West

Discover Grimsby's history at the 1798 Heritage House and War of 1812 Battlefield Site. Take a guided tour to explore architecture, artifacts, Nelles family history, and the 1790s lifestyle. The Manor hosts diverse events, programs, and demonstrations for an immersive historical experience.

9 GRIMSBY MUSEUM

6 Murray Street

Home to the Town Bell and Cenotaph, explore Grimsby's history at the community museum, showcasing artifacts from Grimsby and nearby areas. Engage with education programs, tours, workshops, and events for an enriching experience.

10 GRIMSBY LIONS POOL

1 Elm Street

The Grimsby Lions Community Pool is an outdoor heated pool that operates from mid-June until Labour Day weekend each year. The facility hosts a variety of programming, including swimming lessons, public swims, family swims and adult lane swims.

11 GRIMSBY FARMERS' MARKET

Main Street

The Grimsby Farmers' Market runs from May - October each year on Thursdays from 3 - 7 pm. You can find the market in Downtown Grimsby on Main Street between Christie Street and Ontario Street.

12 PEACH KING CENTRE

162 Livingston Avenue

Full-service recreation facility and community hub. Home to numerous sports organizations, twin arena pads, outdoor rink, auditorium, fitness centre, and splash pad.

13 BEAMER MEMORIAL CONSERVATION AREA

1479 Baseline Road, Winona

Scenic lakefront place with picnic areas and outdoor activities such as boating, fishing and swimming.

14 MURRAY STREET PARK

126 Main Street West

The site is linear along the shoreline, stretching approximately 1km from East to West, and offers stunning views of Lake Ontario.

15 NELLES BEACH PARK

126 Main Street West

Popular Lakefront Park with 2 small walking path and baseball diamond - perfect for sunset viewing.

16 FORTY MILE CREEK PARK

447 Elizabeth Street

This park hosts the historic Elizabeth Street Pumphouse, a large open space along the waterfront with gardens and a nearby trail that runs along 40 Mile Creek. This site is also home to an international peace garden.

17 NELLES BEACH PARK

91 Lake Street

Beautiful waterfront park with beach access, beach volleyball court, playground and lots of shaded areas.

18 SHAYNE ARMSTRONG SKATE PARK

2 Clarke Street

Offering a variety of features for new and experienced skaters. Open from 9 am - dusk and in the summer until 11 pm. Protective equipment and helmets are strongly encouraged.

19 STEVE MCDONNELL LEASH FREE DOG PARK

170 Lake Street

Leash free dog park open from 7 am until dusk daily. A great park for dogs to run and meet other dog families.

20 MAYFAIR PARK

359 Baker Road North

Mayfair Park is a community park with green space and recreational elements such as a playground, swings, basketball half-court and four pickleball courts.

21 GRAND OLD WHITE OAK TREE STAND

10 Grand Avenue

The Grand Avenue Oak Tree Stand is a designated cultural heritage resource, the area was considered an ideal gathering place for its scenic beauty and the variety of mature trees which provided shade.

22 CORONATION PARK

77 Main Street West

Coronation Park is located in Downtown Grimsby and runs beside the 40 Mile Creek. It is a popular location for community events, family picnics and strolls through Grimsby.

23 CENTENNIAL PARK

106 Main Street East

Centennial park is an 8.2 hectare park complete with a picnic pavilion, baseball diamonds, a nearby playground and a rose garden. The park also has a large stone staircase, a small bridge and some great spots for family photos.

24 CASABLANCA WATERFRONT PARK

420 North Service Road, 428 North

Service Road, 30 Place Polonaise Drive

The site is linear along the shoreline, stretching approximately 1km from East to West, and offers stunning views of Lake Ontario.

25 MURRAY STREET PARK

126 Main Street West

Popular Lakefront Park with 2 small walking path and baseball diamond - perfect for sunset viewing.

26 SOUTHWARD COMMUNITY PARK

84 Mud Street West


The park hosts 4 baseball diamonds, 9 soccer fields of various sizes, and a leash free dog park. The park also has a 2.5km walking trail that meanders throughout the park and goes through a forested wetland with views of the pond area.

TRAILS & ROUTES

BRUCE TRAIL

Gibson Street to 28 Quarry Road

A part of the Bruce Trail passes through Grimsby. This popular hiking trail runs through Beamer Valley and over the Forty Mile Creek before heading to the top of the escarpment where it has four lookouts, offering an excellent view of Lake Ontario and the Town of Grimsby. brucetrail.org



SOUTHWARD PARK TRAIL

84 Mud Street West

A 2.5 km walking trail that runs along the majority of the perimeter of the park. The trail has multiple pathway options and goes through a forested area at the back of the park that has a small pond.

WATERFRONT TRAIL

Winston Road Fifty Point Conservation Area to Elizabeth Street Forty Mile Creek Park

The Great Lakes Waterfront Trail offers an on-road cycling trail of over 3000 km, connecting 140 communities along the Canadian shores of the Great Lakes. It is a great place for a quick stroll or long distance adventure, passing in front of historical cottages. waterfronttrail.org

GREENBELT CYCLING ROUTE

Ridge Road to Fruitland Ramble Side Loop

A part of the Greenbelt Route Trail: the 475 km route connects cyclists to a beautiful protected countryside from Northumberland to Niagara. greenbelt.ca/explore
