## **1. Grimsby Lions Club Pool**

Early settlement at the Forty, how our natural topography and Indigenous peoples shaped the town, early industry.

## **2. Mountain St. and Elm St.**

Redevelopment of the Grout Foundry in 1879, an evolving downtown site. Adding modern layers to heritage buildings.

## **3. Main Street West**

A Georgian residential corridor becomes Main Street, reflecting on accommodation and services in the downtown, Century Condos.

## **4. Main St. E. & Elm St.**

Adding modern layers in a growing historic community.

## **5. Main St. E. & Robinson St.**

How has the town evolved to accommodate the need for transportation, what will this look like in the future? Downtown Reimagined.

## **6. Robinson St. & John St. stacked towns**

Grimsby's built form has been evolving since 1790, downtown infilling.

## **7. The Great Western Railway**

How the arrival of rail inspired a downtown.

## **8. Adelaide Street**

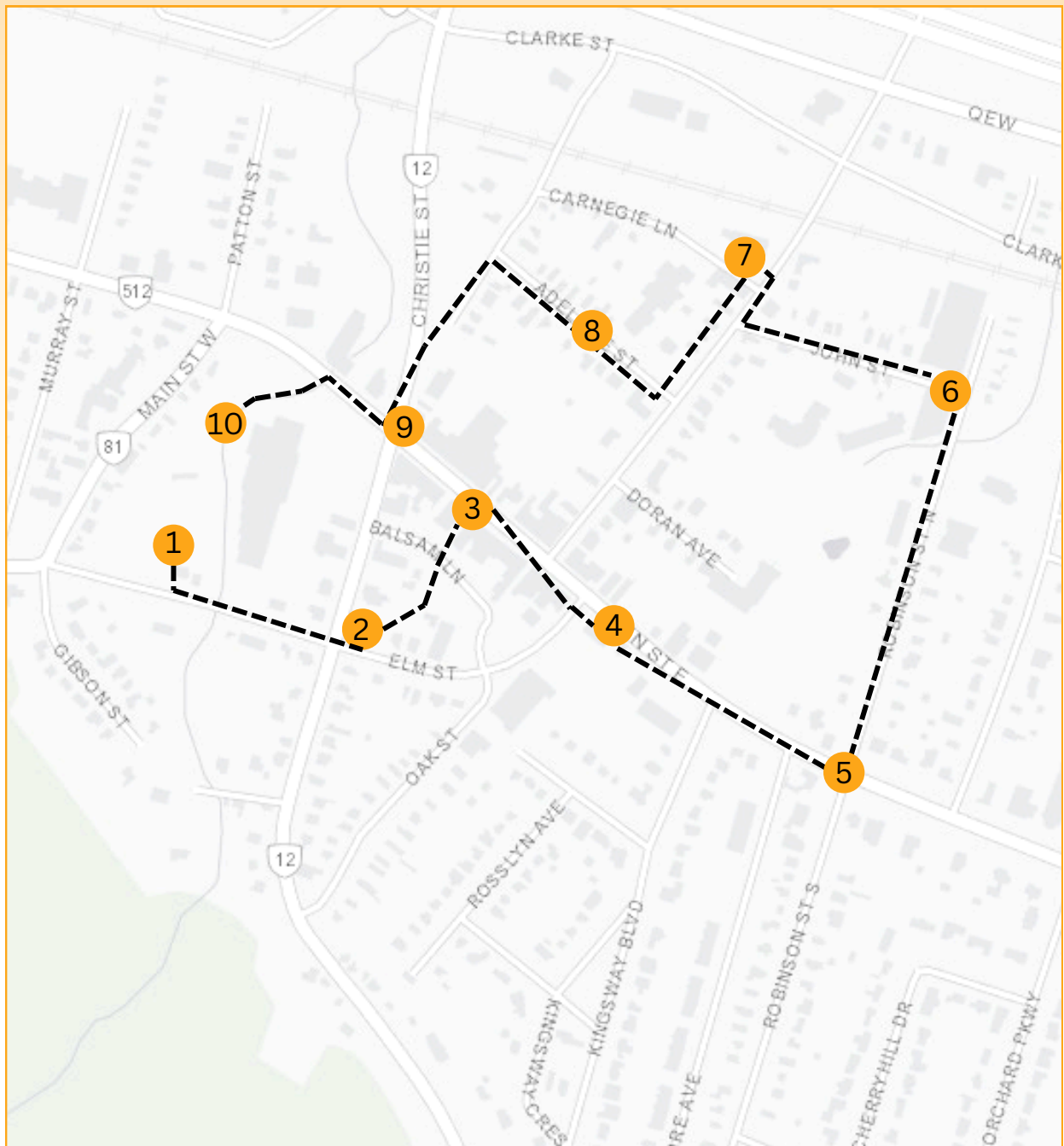
Creating industry and housing the working class, how can our buildings adapt?
